

FIVE THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT: DHS S&T'S INFORMATION SHARING ASSESSMENT TOOL (ISAT)



ISAT enables public safety officials to assess the current state of their information sharing capabilities and gaps at an agency, jurisdiction, multi-discipline and multi-jurisdictional level.



ISAT guides agencies to a better understanding of how their information sharing capabilities align with the Interoperability Continuum. Agencies can identify what they believe are the biggest barriers to their operations.



Public safety officials can complete the ISAT online in as little as 20 minutes.



ISAT has been piloted and validated in communities such as: the City and County of Denver, Colorado; Northern Virginia; City of Marshalltown and Marshall County, Iowa; Marin County, California; and twice in New Orleans, Louisiana.



The ISAT 2.0 launched nationwide in December 2019 and is available now.

The DHS Science and Technology Directorate's Information Sharing Assessment Tool (ISAT) is an easy-to-use tool for first responders from across the nation to identify their own information sharing capabilities and gaps. In as little as 20 minutes, users can complete the ISAT to pinpoint the most pressing information sharing barriers to their agency's operations. The ISAT aims to empower communities to develop an action plan to address their most pressing information sharing gaps; publicize their progress and achievements; and facilitate inter-agency and cross-discipline information sharing discussions among partners. The ISAT was developed by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security Science and Technology Directorate with the guidance of local, state and federal public safety practitioners. The ISAT is a tool for first responders, developed by first responders.
